our years ago the main goal of the English Speaking Cancer Association's (ESCA)

PADDLEforCANCER Dragonboat Festival was—and still is—to be a cancer awareness-raising campaign. Financially, our objective was to break even, but it was such a huge success that it became a major fundraiser as well. This year the Festival netted over CHF 90K.

The introduction of the first Fundraiser's Challenge Cup encouraged extra fundraising by individual team members and brought in more than CHF 22K in additional funds. These proceeds will benefit the Pediatric Oncology Units of CHUV, Lausanne, and HUG, Geneva, as well as ESCA's Counseling Fund. Proceeds from the races and sales on land will cover our operating expenses and enable us to fund our Drop-In Center, professional counseling services, training and supervision of ESCA volunteers, special awareness events, and activities during October's International Breast Cancer Awareness month.





PADDLEforCANCER is now run mainly by volunteers, but we continue to secure the help of a specialist company who supply the boats, paddles, life vests and experienced helmspeople. In this way we can ensure the safest and most professional event possible.

The collaboration with L'Abbaye and the Centre Sportif de la Vallee de Joux, the enthusiasm of our sponsors and teams, and the hard work and dedication of our volun-



teers managed a record crowd of over 3,000 people, bringing order to all the activities on lake and shore. We sincerely thank you, every one, for your boundless support. We couldn't do it without you!

Kids Stay Afloat; Adults Don't!

In the mini-regatta, 120 children aged six to fifteen raced in mini dragonboats (dinghies) and canoes throughout the day without mishap. Experienced volunteers, however, including those who steered the children's boats in every heat, did not fare so well in their own impromptu canoe race when one paddler took a mighty stroke and tipped the balance, sending the crew into the Lac. Even the person in charge of water activities got soaked! The children stayed dry as their teams progressed through a number of heats to the finals.

Volunteers, led by Denise von Maur and Jan Ireland, steered each boat, guided the crew members in and out of their vessels, and during the lunch break provided pleasure trips for over 80 more children who were not actually racing. With so many teams on the water - 28 crews in canoes and 16 mini dragonboat teams - volunteers had their hands full insuring the safety of each child. Village Camp Vikings, whose adult team won the corporate category for the third straight year, generously gave extra time and effort to help on the water.
